#### School District Use of Personal Information Notice

- 4. The use of a student's name telephone number, school, grade, parent's name and related contact information for the purpose of taking attendance, emergencies, fieldtrips, planning and/or other school sponsored activities.
- 5. The use of a student's name, school, grade, photo, academic information and/or written material for the school newsletter, yearbook and/or other school publications.
- 6. The use of a student's name, school, grade and/or photo for athletic events, fine arts productions, presentations, fairs celebrations and/or other school sponsored activities.
- 7. The use of a student's photograph, video tape, audio tape and/or interview by the school District personnel or activities held outside of the school.
- 8. The use of a student's name, address, telephone number, school, program, grade, parent's name and related contact information for the purpose of satisfaction surveys.
- 9. The use of a student's name for individual class, club, team and/or group photos/videos/images taken at school sponsored activities for display in the school.
- 10. The use of a student's photo/video/images taken by school District personnel of classroom or other school sponsored activities held within the school for educational purposes.
- 11. The use of a student's name, photo/image, birth date, parent's name, telephone number, address and any student health and/or relevant personal information to assist authorized individuals in responding to emergency situations relating to safety and security, for law enforcement purposes and other legal requirements, and to assist who have severe or life-treating medical or other conditions.
- Note: When the use of a student's name, photos and/or videos by the school board, media or to other outside organizations, where individual students are identified or interviewed and the material will be used outside of the school District, a separate and specific consent is required. Events that are open to the general public, are considered public events, Greater St. Albert Catholic Schools cannot control or prevent the further distribution or use of photos, videos, images or other personal information by those who attend.

#### Re: Christian Family Living/Human Sexuality Program

As part of the Christian Family Living program, we cover the human sexuality component. It is important to inform all of our parents of the curriculum outcomes.

For these lessons we use a resource called Health and Life Skills Alberta Catholic Schools Human Sexuality Outcomes Grade 4 - 9. This resource has been approved by the Bishops of Alberta and covers, from a Catholic faith perspective, the outcomes for human sexuality from the Alberta Learning Health and Life Skills Program.

More information regarding the details of the program and the audio-video resources used is available in your parent handbook or from your child's teacher, the school principal or Colin Loiselle, our Religious Education & Christian Family Life consultant, at 459-7711 Ext. 140. The lesson plans themselves are available on our Division website at <a href="https://www.gsacrd.ab.ca">www.gsacrd.ab.ca</a>. On the home page, simply click once on 'Navigation' in the upper right hand corner. A number of lists will appear. At the bottom of the list entitled Parents, you will find the item Parent Resource Library. The Human Sexuality lessons are the first item and are listed by grade level. Simply click on the grade level.

The outcomes at the grade seven level are as follows:

- The student will examine the wonder of the human reproductive process, and recognize how sexual development is unique and diverse. (For this outcome, boys and girls typically receive separate instruction with a same-sex teacher.)
- The student will explore the effects of social influences regarding gender roles and gender equity; e.g. media, culture, and religion.
- The student will examine the influences on personal decision making for responsible sexual behavior; e.g. family, cultural beliefs and religious and social values.
- The student will explore the personal decision making process from a Catholic perspective.
- The student will examine our Christian principle of human dignity and how this calls us to a chaste life.
- The student will explore abstinence as a faithful response to God's call.

Family life/sexuality instruction is presented in the context of our faith tradition. As a class, we review the concept of puberty and all the changes associated with this stage of their life. They will also review the human reproduction system with terms appropriate to their grade level. Students are reassured that each is a unique individual that matures and develops at their own rate. Students will also examine how media can reduce the human person to an object. We also discuss pornography and how it degrades a human person. In order to make good and life-giving choices, students need an informed conscience, which is formed in the light of Sacred Scripture, Gospel values and the teachings of the Church.

Please be informed that the family life/sexuality instruction will start in spring and could continue into June. We recognize that parents are the primary educators and, hence, have the right to exempt their son or daughter from the human sexuality outcomes instruction.

#### 2018-19

Every student at VJM is enrolled in the IB Middle Years Program (MYP). Our teachers continue to be trained to implement core philosophies and Approaches to Learning in every subject area. Thus all students benefit from the MYP. Teachers implement the Alberta Program of Studies and integrate elements of the MYP in their teaching.

One of the core beliefs of the MYP is that students benefit from a well-rounded education during the middle years which includes exposure to Language, Fine Arts, Design and Service. Thus a certificate can be achieved by a student if they select complimentary course offerings fulfilling the IB philosophy. A student can achieve an Advanced or Regular certificate at the end of grade nine by successfully meeting the requirements below:

#### Advanced Certificate Requirements

- A student would choose one option from each of the Language B, Fine Arts and Design groupings every year grade 7 through 9.
- Creation and maintenance of an IB Portfolio.
- Successful completion of the Community Project during the grade nine school year.

#### Regular Certificate Requirements

- A student would choose a minimum of one option from two out of three of the Language B, Fine Arts and Design groupings every year grade 7 through 9.
- Creation and maintenance of an IB Portfolio.
- Successful completion of the Community Project during the grade nine school year.

Ex: A student chooses French, CTF Foods and Fashion and CTF Sports Med. They would be registered in the Regular Certificate Track because they are choosing options from two of the three required groupings.

Ex: A student chooses French, CTF Robotics and Drama. They would be registered in the Advanced Certificate Route because they are selecting options from all three required groupings.

Ex: A student chooses CTF Foods and Fashion, CTF Sports Med., Art and Band 7. They would be registered in the Regular Certificate Track because they are choosing options from two of the three required groupings.

Ex: A student chooses CTF Robotics, CTF Construction, CTF Sports Medicine and CTF Outdoor Education. They would not qualify for a Certificate Track because they are choosing options from only one of the required grouping.

#### Option Course Menu GRADE SEVEN - 2018-19

Our option course menu includes course offering from French Language, Fine Arts, Communication & Technology Foundations (CTF) & Design and Complimentary courses.

The CTF curriculum has five areas of possible study. *Business, Communication, Human Services, Resources and Technology* represent occupational groupings found within industry. These occupational clusters are aligned with the Career and Technology Studies (CTS) occupational clusters as well as the National Occupational Classification. An occupational area is a grouping of courses that focuses on attitudes, skills and knowledge related to specific work areas. The main goals of courses in the CTF cluster is:

#### **CTF and the Cross-curricular Competencies**

CTF emphasizes the development of cross-curricular competencies through an exposure to the occupational areas. A cross-curricular competency is an interrelated set of attitudes, skills and knowledge that is drawn upon and applied to a particular context for successful learning and living.

#### **CTF and the Learning Journey**

CTF supports a learning journey where students explore interests and passions while developing skills and cross- curricular competencies and making connections to career possibilities and technologies within any combination of the CTS occupational areas. Students work toward a shared goal by creating a product, performance, completing a challenge or service.

#### Alignment with CTS

CTF supports the transition to the high school CTS program by developing the foundation for students to make reasonable choices as they consider CTS courses. CTF provides students with a strong foundation of attitudes, skills, knowledge and practical experiences related to occupational areas that will assist them in making informed decisions prior to entering the senior high school CTS program. **CTF is NOT a prerequisite for high school CTS**.

NOTE: Several options are listed below. The availability of option offerings is based upon student enrolment, human and budget resources. Once the options are determined, we will make every attempt to place students in options of their choice but because of the high demand it may be necessary to substitute certain options.

## IB Language B Grouping

FRENCH 7 (Advanced)	Full Year
Advanced French has the same themes as French 7; however, a greater emphasis will be placed on enrichment activities and the development of skills to facilitate students' entrance into high school level French course. Students entering this course should have a good attitude, motivation, interested in improving all components of the French language. Teaching and assignments will be tailored to meet individual needs and interests.	There are no extra fees or materials for French.

FRENCH 7 (Regular)	Full Year
The goal of this French program is to provide opportunities for students to develop knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to communicate in French in a variety of real life situations. Each level specifies expectations in four integrated components: communication, culture, language system, and strategies for language learning. Themes include: school, weather, people around us, holidays and celebrations. The course will be complemented to meet the needs and interests of students.	There are no extra fees or materials for French.

## IB Fine Arts Grouping

ART 7	Half Year
This option allows students to work with a variety of materials to develop their style in: acrylic paints, pen & ink, chalk, oil pastels, tempura paints, sidewalk paints, etc. Students develop their skills through a variety of projects, ongoing individual sketchbooks and get the chance to take part in art contests.	Students are required to have their own sketch book. It can either be purchased from the school or students may acquire it on their own.

BAND 7	Half Year
This option allows students to learn a concert band instrument and provides opportunity to perform publicly. Students gain basic music reading skills and develop musicianship through actively participating in class. Young musicians gain appreciation for making music as an ensemble and being an important contributor to a musical team.	Students rent or purchase their own instruments. Semester fees for rentals go toward maintenance, repair & replacement and vary depending on the instrument. The Band Director will help facilitate the rental or purchase process. Students will be responsible for transporting their instrument to and from school; larger instruments are not permitted on the school bus.

DRAMA 7	Half Year
Here is your opportunity to be a <b>star</b> as well as a part of what goes on <b>behind</b> the scenes! Learn what it takes to design costumes, masks and make-up, create the set and put together sound and lighting effects. The course will be complemented with theatre sports, movement games, smaller group performances such as Sword Play and of course, the development of your <b>acting</b> skills! Get the opportunity to put your knowledge to the test as a member of the stage crew for an actual VJM production. Self-discipline, imagination, teamwork, and the ability to have fun are all needed!	There are no extra fees for Drama 7.

GUITAR 7	Half Year
Sign up and learn to play guitar! This option will introduce students to guitar fundamentals. Students will gain music-reading skills and develop musicianship through active class participation and individual practice. Opportunities for individual and ensemble performance will also be presented.	Students rent or purchase their own acoustic guitars. Students will be responsible for transporting their guitar to and from school; please note they are not permitted on the school bus. (Secure school storage is available)  NOTE: There are a limited number of school guitars available. Priority is given to those who can't afford rental or have no way of transporting their guitar between home & school.

## IB CTF & Design Grouping

CONSTRUCTION 7 (INDUSTRIAL ARTS) CTF - COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY	Half Year
Students in this course will explore interests and passions while making personal connections to career possibilities and technologies associated with various Career and Technology Foundations (CTF) occupational areas. Students will explore basic fundamentals of safety, shop management, woodworking and fabrication while working through engaging, hands-on challenges. Students will apply project management skills as they are introduced to the design cycle of the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program (IB MYP). CTF 7 will enable students to participate in hands-on learning experiences and work towards creating real-life products, presentations or services. All projects are adjusted to match student readiness for successful completion.	There may be an additional charge if students choose to build advanced projects. Additional cost is to cover materials or special items needed to complete the project.

FOODS & FASHION 7 CTF - HUMAN SERVICES - COMMUNICATION	Half Year
Looking for that creative, inspired, and perfect personal look? Select a project of your choice, at a level that works for you, and create. Students will learn and develop a variety of skills including hand sewing and machine sewing techniques, and apply them to the classroom, but also the world outside of school.  Working within a group, students will learn skills and techniques in the kitchen, practice hygiene, examine nutrition, and work with a variety of real life challenges such as budget, allergies, vegetarianism, gluten intolerance, etc. to create amazing food and experiences.	Students will be required to pay an additional fee to cover the cost of their sewing projects. Depending upon the project selected, fees will run between 15 and 50 dollars. This fee will be collected within the first few weeks of classes in September (Term 1) or February (Term 2), after students have made their choice of project. Students will not have to purchase anything for their projects on their own as all projects will be ordered and delivered directly to the school. More information about the sewing and foods projects will be sent home to parents in a letter at the beginning of each semester.

OUTDOOR EDUCATION 7 CTF - RESOURCES	Half Year
This course is designed to give students an appreciation of the environment and how we interact with it. Participation is mandatory in all activities. The focus of the option will be Endangered Animals & Shelter Building.	There are no extra fees for Outdoor Education 7.

ROBOTICS 7 CTF - TECHNOLOGY	Half Year
In this course students will design, construct, and build working robots. Robotics 7 allows students to be both creative and independent in their learning while completing various modules. Students will test their problem solving skills in each activity and will be introduced to the basics of computer programming. The designing and building of robots will be done using Lego Mindstorm Education kits.	A \$10.00 fee will be charged to cover costs of Mindstorm kit maintenance.

## Complimentary

SPORTS MEDICINE 7 CTF - RESOURCES	Half Year
This course is intended to provide learning opportunities for students with career plans in medical and related fields as well as active student athletes. The following topics provide an organizational structure for the course: a) immediate care, prevention, and rehabilitation of athletic injuries, b) basic anatomy and physiology, c) arm injuries and taping.	A \$10.00 fee will be charged to cover costs of taping supplies.

WRITERS INK 7 CTF - COMMUNICATION	Half Year
Do you love to tell stories, share your opinions and hook people with your imagination? Then Writers Ink. is the option for you! Try a creative writing course where <b>you</b> are the author and <b>you</b> get to pick your own topics. (Use the writing process to plan, write, revise & edit your own fiction or non-fiction.)  This option is for students who love to write and would like to publish their work. It will provide an opportunity for students to write for enjoyment, personal growth and to enter writing contests.  Students will explore various mediums such as: short stories, newspaper articles, mini-books, poetry, illustrated children's books, etc. They will revise their work in teams, and then send the finished product off to writing contests and magazines in an attempt to win and/or be published.  Most projects will be decided on an individual basis depending on interests of students.	There are no extra fees for Writers Ink. Students will either bring a notebook or a Chrome book to class to write.
